Dear Parents / Carers,

We are already 4 weeks into the new term! It's amazing how quickly time flies in school! There are just a few updates and reminders this week that parents will need to be aware of.

Last year we trialled swapping the Lower and Upper School performances. However, we have decided that last year's arrangements will be a one off. As such, this year's Early Years and Lower School performances will be at Christmas and the Upper School performance will revert to its previous date of early July. So please note down the dates in your diaries for the Lower School performance which will be at Christmas this year.

I have spoken to the children this week about playing on the large climbing frame in the KS2 playground. Please remember that this is not allowed before or after school. Adults allowing their children to play on this equipment do so at their own risk and we accept no responsibility for any injuries caused. The equipment is also far too big for younger children to use so please support by keeping children off the equipment.

Please remember that parents are also responsible for their children's conduct and safety whilst on the site out of school hours. We open the gates at 8.30am in order to help traffic issues and for pupils to line up ready to come into school at 8.45am. I must remind parents that you should not leave children unaccompanied at this time. If you choose to drop your child off and then leave, you need to understand that this is at your own risk. If an unaccompanied child leaves the site after parents have left between 8.30am and 8.45am we may not know about this until registers open at 8.55am. This a potential safeguarding issue so please support us in making sure that your children are safe before and after school.

It was great to see many of you at our Macmillan Coffee afternoon today. We have raised a great amount of money for a very worthwhile charity.

In the next few weeks we will be celebrating the 'Harvest'. As usual we will be donating any food donations to local food banks so if you can spare any tins, dried foods or long lasting foods then please send them into school and we will make sure that they go to families that need them over the winter months. Please make sure that any donations are in date and unopened.
