PE and Sports Premium Statement

2017-2018

The government has provided Sports Premium funding for the academic year 2017-2018 to provide additional and sustainable improvements to PE and sport for the benefit of pupils and to encourage the development of healthy and active life styles.

Allocations for the academic year 2017 to 2018 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6 as recorded in January 2017 census. It will see money going directly to primary school head teachers to spend on improving the quality of sport and P.E.

Allocation of the funding 2017 – 2018

Netherbrook Primary School received in total **£19,520.00** for this academic year. This money has been spent on the following:

- A comprehensive programme of lunchtime clubs run by fully qualified sports coaches including: football, basketball, netball and tri-golf.
- A full programme of after school sports clubs partly subsidised by the school.
- Purchase of a new scheme of work for P.E and sport.
- Reduced cost access to all Sports Premium funded before and after school activities for children in receipt of Pupil Premium.
- Purchase of new P.E /sports equipment/resources in school
- Purchase of 11 new pieces of 'Park Grade' outdoor exercise equipment. This equipment is heavy duty exercise equipment designed for primary age pupils. It will be used to create two 'Active Zones' in the KS1 and KS2 playgrounds where pupils can exercise using rowers, slalom skis, exercise bikes and balance beams etc. This equipment will be used at break time and lunch time by all pupils and is done in conjunction with 'The Daily Mile' programme and a new 'Healthy Break Policy' ensuring pupils only have fruit or vegetables at break time. All of this is designed to ensure pupils are active and healthy during their time in school.

The sustainability and implementation of these resources will be monitored by the Headteacher, Senior Leadership Team and the P.E. Subject Leader.
