TOPIC

In the Spring term we learn about animals through all foundation subjects including art, geography, history, P.S.H.E, P.E, D&T and R.E. We specifically look at:



Introduction

Welcome back after the Christmas break!

Following a very productive first term in Year 1, we would like to inform you of the key learning opportunities that your child will be participating in throughout the Spring Term. The children are working very hard and we'd like to thank

you for all your continuing support.

I'm learning to spell key words correctly.

I'm learning to read what I have written to check my sentences make sense.

I'm looking forward to learning about different types of animals.

I'm learning mental maths skills with my Numeracy Passport (number bonds to 10/20, doubles up to at least 10 and halves, counting in 2s, 5s and 10s).

Literacy

This term in Literacy, we will be focussing on:

- Handwriting: Children will now be following the new 'Kinetic Letters' scheme. The will be trying new positions which should support and enable them to write quickly and confidently.
- Keys to a complex sentence: the children will be encouraged to extend their sentences using connectives, e.g. and, then, because, so, also etc to help them generate compound sentences.
- Spelling key words correctly and reinforcing the need for finger spaces and full stops. The children will still be encouraged to read what they have written in order to check their writing makes sense.
- How to use speech bubbles, speech marks, a comma and exclamation marks.

Phonics

- We would like to thank you for your support in helping your child to read and spell their key words.
- Most children are making good progress with their spellings but now need to apply this knowledge when writing long pieces of work independently.
 - We are encouraging the children to read alien (non-sense words) and real words on a daily basis which enables the children to apply their phonic knowledge to blend sounds in words.
- Every child has been given a copy of the 'Simple Speed Sounds Chart' to reinforce their sound knowledge.

You can help at home by:

- Practising weekly spellings
- Providing lots of opportunities for your child to read and write at home.

Maths

This term in Maths, we will be focussing on:

- Reading and setting times, including o'clock, half-past, quarter past and quarter to. The children will also be encouraged to read the time on a digital clock as well as an analogue.
- Finding halves and quarters of shapes, objects and numbers
- Partitioning and recombining tens and units
- Number names (one, two, three etc)
- Worded problems involving addition and subtraction:

Solving problems involving pence and pound coins. Please encourage your child to identify coins and notes and use them in real-life shopping experiences.

• Using their addition and subtraction knowledge to identify mystery numbers in a sum, e.g. 'how many more make...?'

Numeracy Passport

The children are learning how to develop their mental maths skills using the 'Numeracy Passport'. We are working on:

Counting in 2's, starting from 0 and 1 (odd and even street)
 5's and 10's

You can help at home by:

- Encouraging your child to complete any Maths Passport target sheets sent home by Mrs Slater.
- Exploring numbers around you e.g. when shopping reading prices and adding/subtracting them, exploring money and its value and numbers all around (e.g. number plates, house numbers etc).
- When walking/driving to school encourage your child to recall numbers facts e.g. 1 more/1less, doubles to 10 and number bonds to 10.
