- Perhaps wear your amazing Easter Bonnets you wore in Reception (they were amazing!) You could have a bonnet parade around your home or garden.
- Keep up with the Joe Wicks workouts – eating chocolate is great but it's important to keep exercising it off too!
- Why not go for a Spring walk outside with a grown up? Can you spot the signs that Spring is here – buds on the trees, flowers growing?
- **If you were at school, we might spend 2 days on an activity, so feel free to do the same and consolidate your learning in a variety of ways.**
- Do you remember when we were in Reception and we were able to watch the stages of the life cycle of a butterfly? My girls are very excited to receive their caterpillars to observe at home.
