



<p>Our book focus will be: The Very Hungry Caterpillar If you don't have a copy of the book, please use the link https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=75NQQ-Sm1YY</p>	
<p>Our focus song will be: 'There's a Tiny Caterpillar on a Leaf' https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=JOlbSE0CmNM</p>	
<p>Using fingerprints try to re-create the first page in the book. Its very colourful, what colours can you see?</p>	
<p>Using the playdough recipe have a go at making a Caterpillar, how many legs will you give it? You could use twigs from the garden or from your walk to use for legs.</p>	
<p>Have a go at preparing lunch, don't forget to wash your hands and sing your favourite nursery rhyme whilst you are washing them. Do you like the same fruit as The Very Hungry Caterpillar?</p>	
<p>Using a lollipop stick make a Caterpillars body. What colour will you make its body? To give it some legs use clothes pegs. This activity is great for developing fine motor skills. Count how many legs you have given the Caterpillar.</p>	
<p>Using Paper plates can you re-create the story, you could use real fruit as props to place in the Caterpillars belly</p>	

Singing Hands use Makaton to re-tell the story. What signs can you pick up from watching them? Try to learn the sign for Caterpillar and Butterfly.

There are lots of different things you can use around the house to make a caterpillar. We would love to see pictures of how and what you used to make yours.



Using an empty kitchen or toilet roll tube and your hand prints you can make a beautiful butterfly. Have you spotted any butterflies in your garden or on your walks?



Using sponge and a bobble or elastic band you can do some butterfly printing. How many can you print?



Have a look in your garden or on your walks for Caterpillars and butterflies. Butterflies love orange peel, why not leave some in your garden or on your daily walks and see if it attracts one.

Here is a lovely maths song for you to learn, try to use your fingers to represent the butterflies. You could even cut out the butterfly prints that you have done with the sponge and use them in the song too.
